- a. Find reason to believe that Checks and Balances for Economic Growth violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(c)(1) (formerly 2 U.S.C. § 434(c)(1)) or in the alternative 52 U.S.C. § 30104(f)(1) (formerly 2 U.S.C. 434(f)(1)) and 52 U.S.C. § 30120(d)(2) (formerly 2 U.S.C. § 441d(d)(2)).
- b. Authorize an investigation.
- c. Direct Counsel to draft an appropriate Factual and Legal Analysis.
